**DIRECTIONS:** The Portsmouth Ohio State Highway Patrol Post is located approximately 7 miles north of Portsmouth and 3 miles south of Lucasville on U.S. Rt. 23.

**SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY:** LT Mike Crispen is a 15 year veteran of the Highway Patrol assigned as the Post Commander for the Portsmouth Post. He was assigned as an academy instructor in Columbus at the Ohio State Patrol Academy for four years. He has served as the Highway Patrol's lead firearm's instructor and lead instructor for the Use of Force/Response to Resistance program. He was one of the authors of the Highway Patrol's Response to Resistance policy and author of the book *Mental Survival* for law enforcement. Mike has his degree in Law Enforcement/Criminal Justice from Ohio University and has served as an instructor at Ohio University for 11 years. Prior to joining the Patrol, Mike served 6 years in the U. S. Army. As the Commander for the Portsmouth Highway Patrol Post, he is responsible for crash and crime within the jurisdiction of the Highway Patrol. He serves as the first line liaison between the local agencies within Scioto County and the leadership of the Highway Patrol. Lt Crispen manages assets from the Highway Patrol assigned to the Scioto County area in an effort to reduce crash and crime statistics. These assets consist of human resources – troopers and civilian staff – and physical equipment for use by these resources. Lt Crispen has been assigned to the Portsmouth Post for three years.

He breaths, bleeds, urinates, has eyes that dilate, a pulse and a heartbeat, and those treating him have the power to save his life or send him into cardiac arrest.

With the ability to emulate nearly perfect humanlike characteristics in emergency situations from massive bodily injury and drug overdoses to a heart attack and allergic reactions, interactive human patient simulation technology is a fast growing trend in training those we depend on to provide care in emergency situations.



Human patient simulation technology is used by leading healthcare educational institutions to train doctors and nurses, US troops in Iraq to train for bio warfare and combat injuries, and by Homeland Security to equip emergency personnel with the skills needed to deal with weapons of mass destruction and bio terrorism. The PACCAR Medical Education Center is located on the campus of Adena Regional Medical Center in Chillicothe.

Far more advanced than the days of the resuscitation trainers, Stan's human patient simulation technology not only mimics symptoms but also responds directly to treatment administered by trainees including oxygen, intravenous drugs and defibrillation—all without the aid of an instructor—bringing real life emergency scenarios to the training field.

Before patient simulation, healthcare trainees were restricted to practicing on lifeless mannequins and often put into the field with technical knowledge, but limited firsthand experience. Simulation provides a lifelike, interactive and visual solution to train those we depend on to protect our loved ones in times of emergency.

“The stress in a training session is very real,” said John Gabis, MD, Executive Director at the PACCAR Medical Education Center. “Since Stan responds directly to the trainees’ actions, students are not only learning technical skills but are exposed to the high-pressure of saving a life in an emergency situation.”

The \$15 million PACCAR Medical Education Center is designed to provide outstanding nursing education collaboratively with Wright State University, Ohio University- Chillicothe, and other partner institutions right in the Chillicothe area. Students in the

program have the chance to earn a pre-licensure Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree through Wright State University in approximately 39 months with prerequisite courses at Ohio University or Wright State and the BSN coursework performed right at the Center. In addition to the David Meade Massie Virtual Hospital, other exciting features of the Center include surgical labs, technologically advanced classrooms, and a spacious auditorium.
