ASQ SVS OFFICER NOMINATION

Mr. Doug Scott, Nomination Committee Chair, has been diligent in bringing forth the nomination list of officers for the Scioto Valley Section ASQ for the 2012 – 2013 year. The nomination letter is located toward the end of the newsletter. Please review this list of officers and be prepared to vote on the nominations at the March program meeting. The proposed officers have many years of experience in quality assurance and will serve this section well in the coming year if confirmed.

MARCH PROGRAM MEETING

DATE: Thursday, March 22, 2012

TOPIC: Quality in Nuclear Power Plant Construction and Tour of the Portsmouth Brewing Co.

We will take a look at the current timeline for the construction of 2 new reactors for Georgia Power. Shaw Stone and Webster, is the construction contractor for the owner, The Southern Company. As this project moves forward, it will be a pivotal time for nuclear energy in this country. All the stakeholders, including other utility companies, will be keeping a close eye on the progress of this plant.

The Westinghouse AP1000 passive BWR provides a streamlined, safe but yet unproven design. The QC functions are essential to preventing missteps, that would lead to change orders and budget overruns. The areas that we will touch on will focus on the work in progress (excavation, foundations, structural, and reactor shell fabrication). The NRC just recently approved the construction and operation license for the owners. These are the first new reactors to be built in the USA in over 25 years.

SPEAKER'S BIOGRAPHY: Joe Moss is currently the QC Manager for Shaw Stone and Webster, at Haverhill Chemicals and Sun Coke Energy, near Ironton, OH. Joe formulates and implements the QA/QC activities for maintenance and capital work performed by Shaw at the facilities. He plans and proceeds with all repairs to fired and unfired pressure vessels, boiler and process piping, utilities, tanks, rotating and fixed equipment. In addition he coordinates all required NDE and third party inspection as required by code and by authority having jurisdiction. He has over 33 years in the construction and maintenance field in all types of industries, power, oil and gas, manufacturing, commercial, and institutional. When he isn't working, he enjoys outdoor sports and spending time with his family and friends.

Haverhill Chemicals is a feedstock producer for the polymer industry. The chemicals they produce (acetone, phenol, and BPA) are used in a wide array of products. These are used in everyday items such as epoxy, plastics, water bottles, compact discs, and pharmaceuticals. The facility has its own steam generation units, barge cells, tank farms, rail spur and a highly trained and efficient maintenance workforce.

The Sun Coke Energy, plant converts coal to Coke for the steel industry. There are 200 ovens that run 24/7, 52 weeks a year. Fifty percent of the finished coke is sold to neighboring AK steel in Ashland, KY. The remaining is bought by Arcelor Mittel, another major steel producer. On the back end of these ovens are 10 heat recovery steam generators. The steam that is produced is used to

power a General Electric turbine and generator, which places power on the grid for wholesale utility purchase.
